REQUIRED

At any stage of training:

- Up to 2 of the following courses: **EMST** course or **APLS** course or **ELS** course

Basic Trainees reimbursed for:

- NZ Primary Examination workshop (normally in Christchurch) in preparation for Primary exam

Advanced Trainees reimbursed for:

- 4.10 presentation at approved conference (requires a letter of support from Director of Training)
- The NZ Pre-Fellowship Examination Course,
OR
- An equivalent Pre-Fellowship Examination Course in preparation for the ACEM Fellowship exam

Advanced Trainees defined as senior registrars under the award may access their Senior Registrar Entitlement to be reimbursed for the following:

- Other relevant conferences to EM training. A letter of suitability of the conference will be required by the VTC. Reimbursement will be up to the limit of the current RDA award.
